## HOW ARE KINDIES ASSESSED?

There are national standards for early childhood services that include a quality rating system. The rating can help you choose the best kindy for your child.

## **Quality areas**

There are seven quality areas against which services are assessed and rated:

- 1. Educational program and practice programs need to address children's individual learning and development needs.
- 2. Children's health and safety your child's service should have policies, procedures and practices to support healthy eating, safety, dealing with injury or illness and preventing harm.
- 3. Physical environment the environment must be safe, suitable and provide rich and diverse experiences to promote learning and development.
- 4. Staffing arrangements the service needs to meet staffing levels, qualification requirements and professional standards.
- 5. Relationships with children educators need to build responsive and respectful relationships with children.
- 6. Collaborative partnerships with families and communities—your service should actively communicate, consult and collaborate with families and communities.
- 7. Leadership and service management—the service must have documented policies, procedures and records, shared values, clear direction and reflective practices for staff.

## Ratings

Services are given a rating for each of the above, and overall. The ratings are: excellent, exceeding national quality standard, meeting national quality standard, working towards national quality standard, significant improvement required.
